WHY WE FAST

Fasting is a spiritual discipline that draws us closer to God. It's not about earning His favor but positioning our hearts to hear His voice more clearly. When we fast, we silence the noise of the world and strengthen our spiritual sensitivity.

Throughout Scripture, God's people fasted before great victories, decisions, and moves of God. Jesus Himself fasted before stepping into His public ministry. As we follow His example, we align our hearts with His will and open the door for supernatural strength, clarity, and power.

Fasting doesn't move God—it moves us. It brings our spirit, soul, and body into alignment with His purposes.

FASTING OPTIONS

Option 1 – Partial Fast

(7am–7pm) Consume fruits, vegetables, nuts, juice, and water during the day. From 7pm to 7am, consume only water.

Option 2 – Juice Fast

(7am–6pm) Consume only juice and water between 7am and 6pm. After 6pm, you may eat a light meal if needed.

Additional Optional Fasts:

Social Media Fast, Spending Fast, or Television Fast.

If you have any medical conditions or take medication, please consult your physician before beginning a fast.

THE ACTS PRAYER MODEL

Use this simple guide each day as you pray:

A

– **Adoration:** Begin by worshiping God for who He is. Express your love, honor, and awe of His greatness.

C

– **Confession:** Humbly confess your sins before Him. Ask for forgiveness and allow His grace to renew your heart.

T

– **Thanksgiving:** Thank God for His blessings, past and present. Gratitude shifts our perspective and strengthens our faith.

S

– **Supplication:** Bring your requests before God. Pray for your needs, your family, your church, and our world with faith and expectation.



DAILY PRAYER POINTS

DAY 1 | EQUIP

Pray that God would equip your heart before He equips your hands.

Hebrews 13:21 – “May He equip you with everything good for doing His will, and may He work in us what is pleasing to Him, through Jesus Christ.”

Ask the Holy Spirit to fill you with power and boldness for this new year.

Acts 1:8 – “But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses...”

Pray for spiritual maturity and growth—that your faith would be strengthened and your character refined.

Ephesians 4:12–13 – “To equip his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up until we all reach unity in the faith...”

Ask God to develop the gifts He’s placed inside of you and to teach you how to use them effectively.

2 Timothy 1:6–7 – “Fan into flame the gift of God... For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives power, love and self-discipline.”

Pray for humility to learn, strength to grow, and wisdom to lead others well.

Proverbs 1:5 – “Let the wise listen and add to their learning, and let the discerning get guidance.”

Pray that Discovery Church would be a house that equips believers—raising disciples, leaders, and difference-makers who impact the world for Jesus.

Ephesians 4:11–12 – “So Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, to equip his people for works of service...”

Declare that 2026 will be a year of divine preparation, spiritual empowerment, and supernatural growth.

Philippians 1:6 – “He who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus.”

Day 2 | Repentance

Pray and ask the Lord to create a clean heart within you.

Psalm 51:10 – “Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me.”

Repent and ask God to forgive you for any area of disobedience or compromise.

James 4:7 – “Submit yourselves, then, to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.”

Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal any hidden sin and bring conviction where needed.

Psalm 139:23–24 – “Search me, God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts.”

Pray for the grace to turn fully to God and walk in righteousness.

Ezekiel 18:30–32 – “Repent! Turn away from all your offenses; then sin will not be your downfall.”

Pray for a spirit of repentance to sweep through Discovery Church.

Acts 3:19 – “Repent, then, and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out, that times of refreshing may come from the Lord.”

Day 3 | Obedience to God

Pray for a heart that delights in obedience and submission to God's

Word. Deuteronomy 5:33 – “Walk in obedience to all that the Lord your God has commanded you, so that you may live and prosper.”

Ask God to help you surrender your will and trust His perfect plan for your life. Romans 12:1 – “Offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship.”

Pray that the Holy Spirit would strengthen your resolve to obey, even when it's difficult. Matthew 16:24 – “Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me.”

Pray for obedience that flows from love, not obligation. John 14:15 – “If you love me, keep my commands.”

Ask God to make Discovery Church a community marked by humble obedience and faithful stewardship. Psalm 119:34 – “Give me

understanding, so that I may keep your law and obey it with all my heart.”

Day 4 | Freedom

Pray for freedom from every sin, stronghold, and spiritual attack.

Ephesians 6:10–11 – “Be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil’s schemes.”

Ask for the power of the blood of Jesus to cleanse and purify your heart.

1 John 1:7 – “The blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin.”

Declare deliverance from every oppressive influence that tries to control or limit your life.

Luke 10:19 – “I have given you authority to overcome all the power of the enemy; nothing will harm you.”

Pray against fear, anxiety, and depression. Declare the peace of God over your mind and heart.

Philippians 4:6–7 – “Do not be anxious about anything... and the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.”

Pray for Discovery Church to be a place of freedom and restoration—where the power of the Holy Spirit breaks every chain.

2 Corinthians 3:17 – “Where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom.”

Day 5 | Obedience to My Call

Pray that God would reveal and confirm His call on your life. Jeremiah 1:5 – “Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I set you apart.”

Ask for clarity to recognize His voice and courage to step into your calling. Isaiah 30:21 – “Whether you turn to the right or to the left, your ears will hear a voice behind you, saying, ‘This is the way; walk in it.’”

Pray for endurance to serve faithfully and resist distraction or discouragement. Hebrews 12:1 – “Let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us.”

Thank God for the gifts and abilities He has given you, and ask Him to show you how to use them for His glory.

1 Peter 4:10-11 – “Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others... so that in all things God may be praised through Jesus Christ.”

Pray that every person at Discovery Church would discover their purpose and serve with joy and excellence.

Romans 12:11 – “Never be lacking in zeal, but keep your spiritual fervor, serving the Lord.”

Day 6 | Divine Vision

Pray that God would open your eyes to see His vision for your life and for Discovery Church. Habakkuk 2:2 – “Write down the revelation and make it plain on tablets so that a herald may run with it.”

Ask God to align your personal goals with His divine purpose.

Proverbs 19:21 – “Many are the plans in a person's heart, but it is the Lord's purpose that prevails.”

Pray for spiritual clarity to discern what God is calling you to focus on in this season. Ephesians 1:18 – “I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you.”

Pray for the fulfillment of Discovery's vision—to reach more people, raise more leaders, and release more disciples into their God-given calling.

Habakkuk 2:3 – “For the revelation awaits an appointed time... Though it linger, wait for it; it will certainly come and will not delay.”

Ask God to remove blind spots and distractions that hinder vision, and to fill our church with faith to see beyond what's visible.

2 Corinthians 5:7 – “For we live by faith, not by sight.”

Day 7 | Divine Direction

Pray for clear guidance in every decision and step you take this year.

Proverbs 3:6 – “In all your ways submit to Him, and He will make your paths straight.”

Ask God to keep you from distractions that lead off His path.

Psalms 37:23 – “The Lord makes firm the steps of the one who delights in Him.”

Pray for wisdom and discernment as you lead in your home, work, and ministry. James 1:5 – “If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault.”

Ask for sensitivity to the Holy Spirit's promptings. John 16:13 – “When He, the Spirit of truth, comes, He will guide you into all the truth.”

Pray that Discovery Church will walk in divine strategy and timing in every decision.

Isaiah 30:21 – “Whether you turn to the right or to the left, your ears will hear a voice behind you, saying, ‘This is the way; walk in it.’”

Day 8 | Divine Discernment

Pray for discernment to recognize God's voice over every other voice.

1 Kings 19:12 – "And after the fire came a gentle whisper."

Ask God to sharpen your spiritual senses to distinguish truth from deception.

Hebrews 5:14 – "But solid food is for the mature, who by constant use have trained themselves to distinguish good from evil."

Pray for wisdom in relationships—aligning with those who strengthen your walk with God. Proverbs 13:20 – "Walk with the wise and become wise, for a companion of fools suffers harm."

Ask for discernment for Discovery's leaders as they guide ministries and make key decisions. Proverbs 2:3–6 – "Indeed, if you call out for insight and cry aloud for understanding... then you will understand the fear of the Lord and find the knowledge of God."

Pray that our church would be rooted in truth and led by the Spirit, not by trends or pressure. 1 John 4:1 – "Dear friends, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God."

Day 9 | Financial Stewardship & Increase

Pray for wisdom to manage every resource God has entrusted to you.

Proverbs 3:9–10 – "Honor the Lord with your wealth, with the firstfruits of all your crops; then your barns will be filled to overflowing."

Ask God to develop a spirit of generosity and faith in giving.

2 Corinthians 9:7–8 – "God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to bless you abundantly..."

Pray for creative ideas, strategies, and partnerships that lead to increase. Deuteronomy 8:18 – "But remember the Lord your God, for it is He who gives you the ability to produce wealth."

Ask the Lord to bless Discovery Church with financial provision to fulfill its mission. Philippians 4:19 – "And my God will meet all your needs according to the riches of His glory in Christ Jesus."

Pray for freedom from debt and fear around finances—for individuals, families, and the church. Psalm 115:14–15 – "May the Lord cause you to flourish, both you and your children."

Day 10 | Advancement of the Discovery Vision

Pray for God's provision and favor to complete every project and expansion—The Kids Center, the Worship Center, and beyond.

Psalms 127:1 – "Unless the Lord builds the house, the builders labor in vain."

Ask God to unite our church in faith and generosity to Finish the Work. 2

Corinthians 9:11 – "You will be enriched in every way so that you can be generous on every occasion."

Pray for boldness to advance the Discovery vision—reaching more people, raising more leaders, and releasing more disciples.

Habakkuk 2:2-3 – "Write down the revelation and make it plain... For the revelation awaits an appointed time."

Ask God to open new doors in cities and communities for the Discovery Network to grow and impact lives.

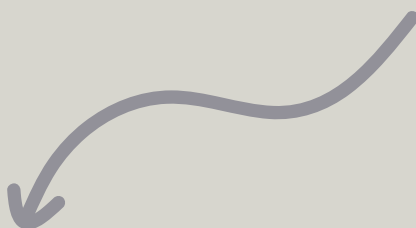
Isaiah 54:2-3 – "Enlarge the place of your tent... stretch your tent curtains wide... you will spread out to the right and to the left."

Pray for divine partnerships, supernatural provision, and unwavering faith to see every vision fulfilled.

Ephesians 3:20 – "Now to Him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to His power that is at work within us."

How to Use This Study

Use this simple rhythm daily to help you slow down, hear God's voice, and grow in your walk with Jesus.



COME & SEE

INTRO

The Gospel of John doesn't begin with a manger or a miracle—it starts with a person. Jesus steps onto the scene not with spectacle, but with an invitation: *Come and see*.

In the first four chapters of John, we meet people who were curious, broken, overlooked, or stuck—and Jesus meets each one with truth that cuts through the noise. John the Baptist points to Him. Andrew brings his brother. Nicodemus comes with questions. A Samaritan woman leaves her shame at the well.

Jesus doesn't recruit followers through hype—He reveals Himself through relationship. He knows your name, your wounds, your questions, and your story. And His invitation still stands: *Come and see*.

²¹ They asked him, "Then who are you? Are you Elijah?"

He said, "I am not."

"Are you the Prophet?"

²² Finally they said, "Who are you? Give us an answer to take back to those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?"

²³ John replied in the words of Isaiah the prophet, "I am the voice of one calling in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way for the Lord.'"

³⁸ Turning around, Jesus saw them following and asked, “What do you want?”

So they went and saw where he was staying, and they spent that day with him. It was about four in the afternoon.

“Come and see,” said Philip.

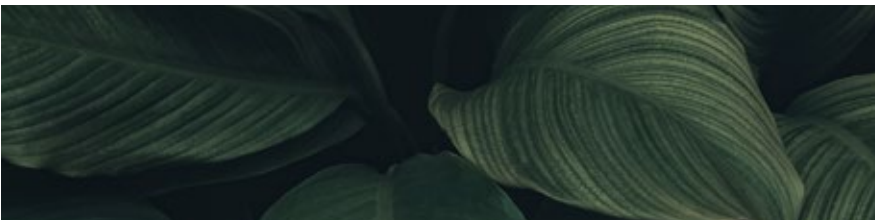
⁴⁷ When Jesus saw Nathanael approaching, he said of him, “Here truly is an Israelite in whom there is no deceit.”

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John Testifies Again About Jesus
