A TALE OF NATURE AND DECEIT



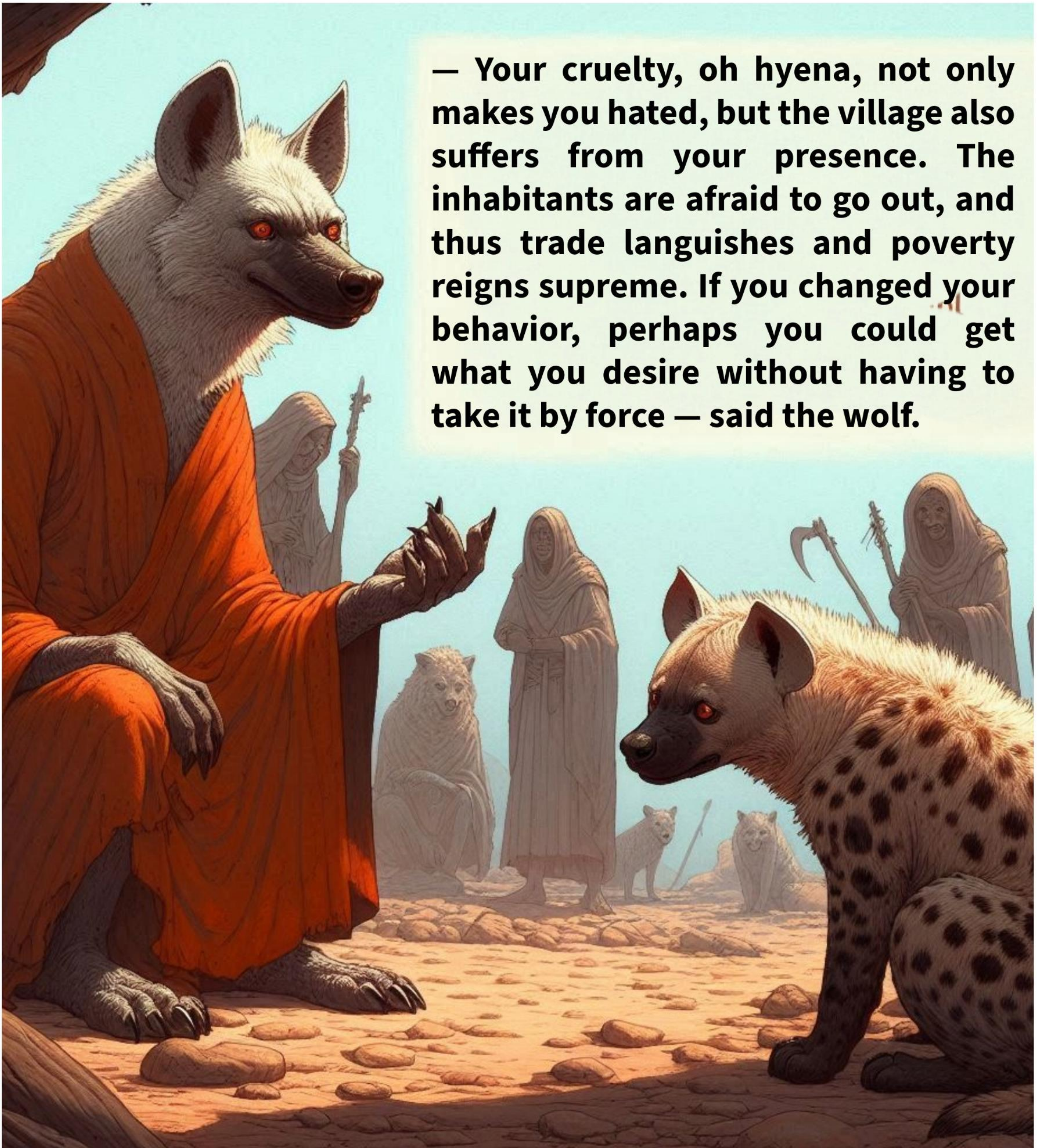

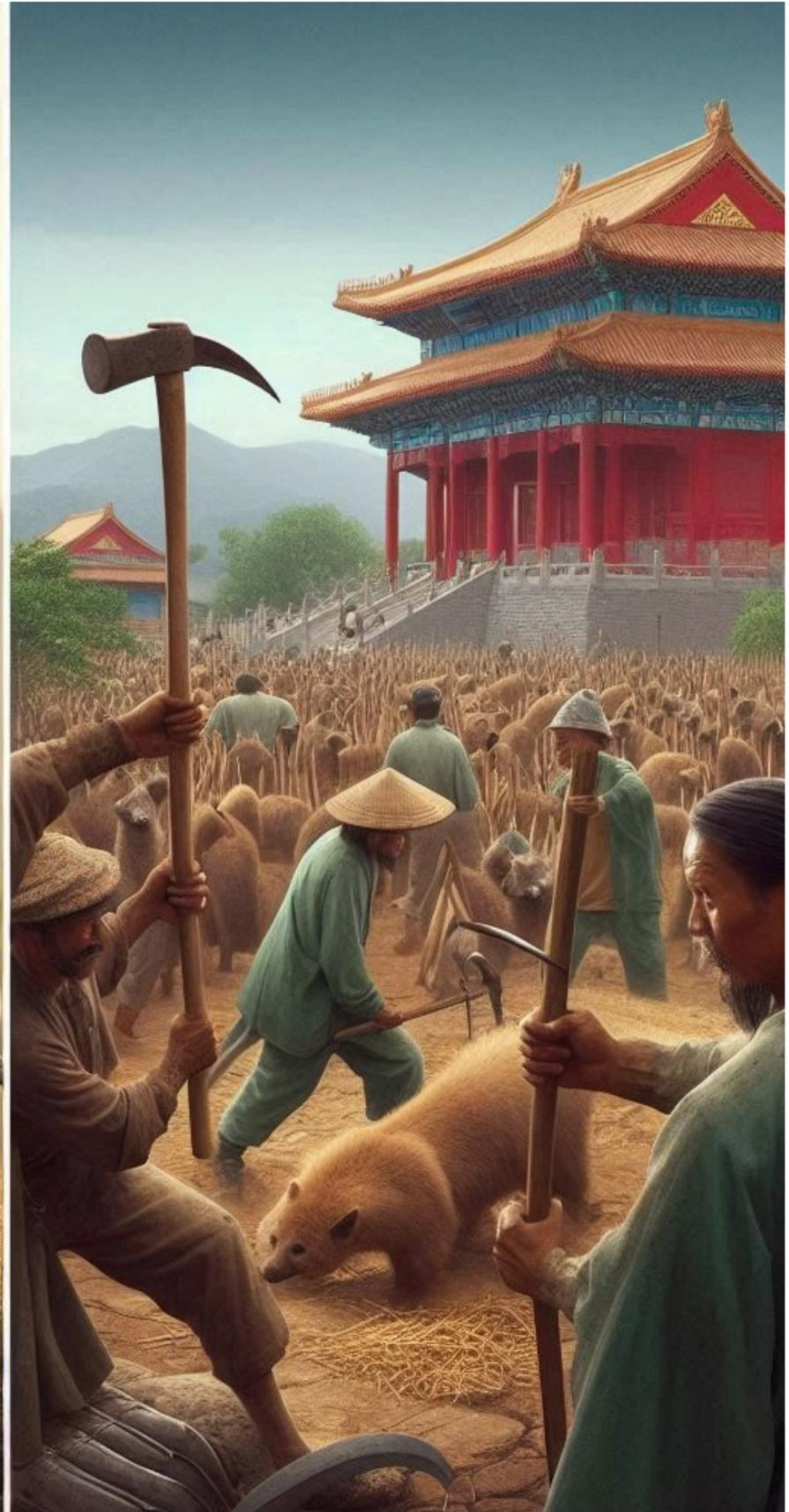
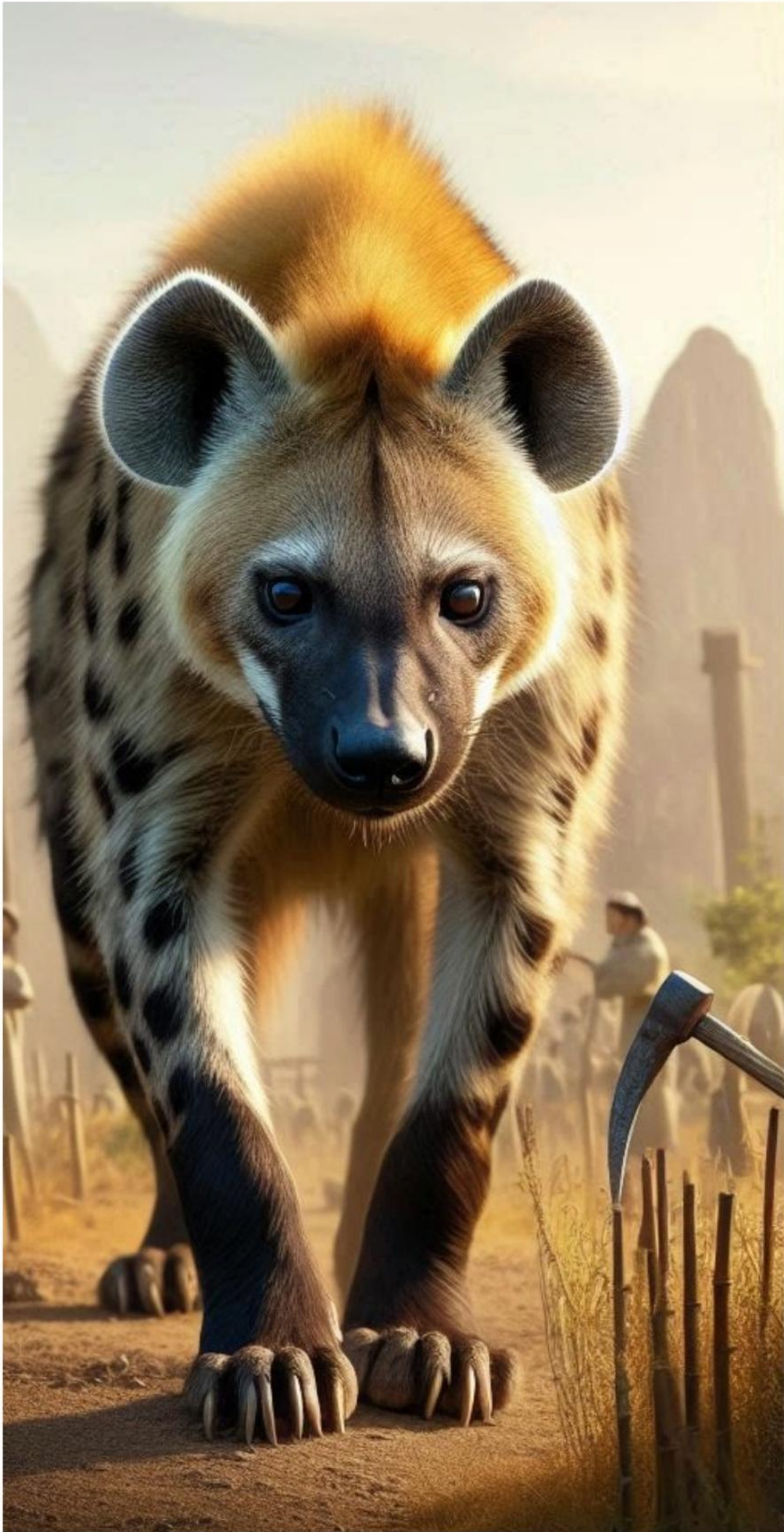
