Quality Design:

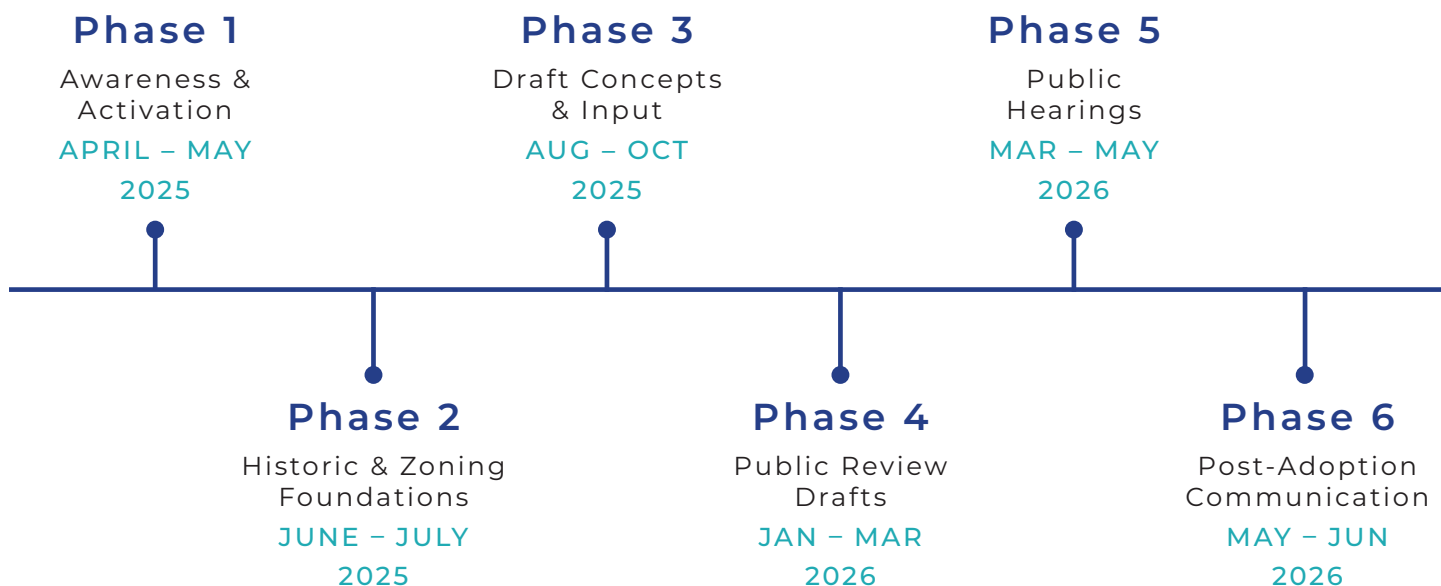
