IN 1990, a scrappy little film roared into theaters with a pirate radio signal and something to say.

Pump Up the Volume, written and directed by ALLAN MOYLE and produced by SANDY STERN, told the story of a shy teenager who finds his voice — and changes everything — when he goes on air with a mic, a message and the audacity to speak the truth. It was raw. It was urgent. And for countless young people, it was the first time they felt truly seen.

Getting *Pump Up the Volume* made wasn't easy. Allan Moyle wrote a script that was smart, subversive and emotionally real — something that didn't fit neatly into a studio box. But with Sandy Stern's passion and commitment, the film found its champions. Together, they fought to preserve its edge and let the story breathe in all its rebellious glory.

When the movie hit, it struck a chord. Starring Christian Slater and Samantha Mathis, critics hailed it as bold, heartfelt and ahead of its time. But what's most remarkable is how it's grown in resonance over the years. In a world now overflowing with noise, the need to "keep the air alive" feels more vital than ever.

We owe so much to Allan and Sandy — for their courage, their vision and their artistry. This musical adaptation stands on the shoulders of their work, and we're honored to bring their story to a new generation.

So grab your seats, spin that radio dial and get ready. The signal is strong... and we have something to say.





## The Band

BEN BARAHONA GINSBERG (Conductor/Pianist) has written music, book, and/or lyrics for several musicals at NYU Tisch and the Academy for New Musicals, Inc., including Minoru Scrapes the Sky (with Momo Akashi), Ramin (with Thalia Ranjbar), and Chessica's Wayward Adventures (with Brian Morales). His songs have been performed with live orchestra at the Las Vegas Composers' Showcase, and in 2022, he was a songwriting fellow at the Johnny Mercer Foundation Songwriters Project. His song "Heaven" was featured on American Idol (Season 17).
